Our School Day

School starts at 9.00 am with the gates open from 8.40 am. Pupils in the Infants go straight into class. School ends at 3.3 0pm for all pupils.



Wrap-around Care Provision

We offer a Breakfast Club for our pupils from 7.30 am Monday to Friday.

Teatime Club is open to 3.30 - 5.30 pm Monday to Thursday (5.00 pm on Fridays). The cost of each session is £5 per child and £4 per sibling. To book a place please contact the school office. Food is provided at both Breakfast Club and Teatime Club.

We also offer a range of after school clubs, which change regularly in order to offer varied and exciting opportunities to our pupils; parents are provided with information regarding these each term.



The wearing of a school uniform gives pupils a sense of belonging to the school community and encourages high standards in presentation. This in turn impacts favourably on both behaviour and attitudes. Our uniform consists of:

- St. Matthew's navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- Light blue polo shirt (school logo optional)
- Grey skirt, trousers, shorts or pinafore/blue and white gingham dress in summer term
- Grey or white socks or tights
- St. Matthew's navy coat optional
- Black sensible school shoes no trainers/trainer type shoes
- Boots may be worn during inclement weather but should be changed when indoors
- No jewellery, including earrings
- PE kit is St Matthew's blue t-shirt, navy blue shorts/plain navy blue jogging bottoms and outdoor trainers

Our Curriculum



We provide a broad, balanced and inclusive curriculum to promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of all pupils with the aim of preparing the pupils at St. Matthew's for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

Our enhanced school curriculum has the national curriculum at its core to provide pupils with an introduction to the essential knowledge that they need to be educated citizens. It introduces pupils to the best that has been thought and said; and helps engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement.

We believe that our teaching develops exciting and stimulating learning experiences in and beyond the classroom to promote the development of pupils' knowledge, understanding and skills as part of the wider school curriculum. We promote universal human values encompassing equality and respect for all, enabling our pupils to value their British status and traditions within an inclusive multi-racial society.

Each year group has a curriculum overview which is shared with parents at the Curriculum Evenings early in the Autumn Term and are also available on our website. Our curriculum is progressive and sequential and is regularly reviewed.

Pupil Voice

We believe strongly in our children shaping and leading decisions made at St. Matthew's and encourage our pupils to join groups that may interest them.

Some of the groups across school which pupils can join are our School Council, Junior Leadership Team, RE Ambassadors, Eco-Warriors, Playground Leaders, Peer Mediators and Mini Vinnies. The groups help to lead change across school and hear the views of their peers.

SEND

We are committed to the equal inclusion of all pupils in all areas of primary school life. We recognise the diverse and individual needs of all pupils and take into account the additional support required by those children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Miss Shawcross is the Designated Teacher for Looked after Children and also our SENDCO. Along with the Headteacher, Mrs Alderson, she is responsible for ensuring all teachers in school understand the implications for those children who are looked after and have SEND.

We also have a designated SEND Governor, Mrs Hall, who works closely with the SENDCO to monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of SEND provision for all children at St. Matthew's.



Our Community



Our Parish

St. Matthew's Catholic Primary serves the parish of St Matthew's Catholic Church in Jarrow, which is part of the Jarrow Cluster of Catholic Churches.

We have very close links with St. Matthew's Church and its parishioners, holding School Masses in Church and visiting Church regularly. We also invite members of the parish to attend events in school, where possible.

We have a very strong Sacramental Preparation Programme, which is led by wonderful volunteer catechists from the Parish. The four Cluster Parish Primary Schools – St Matthews, St Joseph's, St Bede's and St Mary's, also work closely together and our 'RE Pupil Ambassadors' from each school work together to promote spiritual development across the schools.





Friends of St. Matthew's

Or FOSM for short is our Parents and Teachers' Association (PTA). A voluntary group of parents/carers of current pupils whose mission is to provide resources, equipment and events which enhance the education and extra-curricular activity of tour pupils. We work closely with the teaching and support staff to ensure that events we provide and equipment we purchase are in line with the needs and wishes of the pupils and wider school.

Chadwick's Kitchen



Our award winning in-house catering team **Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services** across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay.

Pupils entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily.
